INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

International Women's Day (8th March) is an occasion marked by individual and groups of women around the world. Unfortunately, unlike some countries, it is not a national holiday in the UK but it is however a day to celebrate nonetheless. International Women's Day is when women on all continents, often divided by national boundaries and by ethnic, linguistic, cultural, sexual, economic and political differences, can come together to celebrate their day and look back to a tradition that represents at least nine decades of struggle for equality, justice, peace and development. HOW I FELL IN LOVE WITH ALBERT



LOVING ME! ♥

“Loving Me!” is a new project for women who are or have been experiencing abuse within a relationship with another woman. The aim of the project is to provide a confidential and safe environment for women, removing isolation and providing a place to gain support.

Applications for funding for the project are being submitted. If successful, Loving Me! will initially provide a facilitated support group, then later there will also be a self-help group, information resources, training, and eventually a helpline. It is hoped the first 12-week support group will start in April / May 2002.

The Project is being supported by the Lesbian Community Project, and also has the support of Manchester Rape Crisis, Central Manchester Women’s Aid, the Women’s Domestic Violence Helpline and the Manchester Project. LESBIAN HEALTH

Is there a need for a Lesbian Health Regional Networking Group?

In 1999, Jayne Mugglestone from Bolton Specialist Health Promotion Service produced a report on the Health Needs of Lesbians within the Bolton and Wigan area. The literature review highlights several areas:

- Access to primary and secondary health care is compromised for lesbians because of homophobic and heterosexist attitudes of health care providers and because of the homophobic and heterosexist culture of health care establishments.
- Health information, which is directly relevant to Lesbians, is not available to either health care providers or Lesbians themselves.
- Living in a Homophobic and Heterosexist society has a direct and detrimental effect on Lesbians self esteem, sense of well-being and therefore mental and physical health.
- Lesbians are also affected by oppression related to class, race, disability and age, which will further compromise their access to services and affect their self-esteem and sense of well-being.
- Lesbians do not feel comfortable in coming out to Health care providers because of the fear of negative reactions, a reduced standard in the level of care they receive and fear of abuse.
- Lesbian Health needs are not visible because of the invisibility of lesbians themselves and therefore research into their health needs has to be specifically initiated.
- Lesbians do not feel comfortable in using health services and therefore research into their health needs has to be specifically initiated.
- Lesbians do not feel comfortable in using health services and therefore seek the majority of information and support around their health from social and community networks. They also delay seeking treatment or advice.
- Lesbians want health care, which does not assume that they are heterosexual and that is relevant to their needs. Many Lesbians would prefer to be treated by female health care providers who are non judgemental, well informed and who can offer appropriate, supportive services.
- Women who have sex with women may not define themselves as lesbian or as gay. They may define themselves as heterosexual, bisexual or not use any definition at all. Bisexual Women are particularly invisible.
- There are specific areas of health, which affect lesbians differently to heterosexual women, e.g., breast cancer, sexual health.
- The experience of lesbians is different to that of gay men. Research or information around homosexuality and health has in fact focused on the needs of gay men, not lesbians.

Team Manchester was started up by Chiara Vagnarelli and Duncan Leckie of Health Promotion in 1998. It began as an idea to help lesbians and gay men improve their health and well being through sports and leisure. A fund was set up from the Health Authority, and support given to new and emerging groups, clubs and teams. Since then many activities have begun and gone from strength to strength, as well as the odd few which have floundered. The work of Team Manchester through the Lesbian Community Project and Duncan Leckie is coming to an end, with the production of an Evaluation Report on its achievements and recommendations for the future. A big thank you to all the women who have helped Emma by taking part in this evaluation, particularly the members and organisers of Manchester Stingers WFC, the Jessies, and Lesbian and Gay Salsa.

The report will be out soon, and there will be an event to launch the Report and celebrate the clubs and their achievements. The Report will be distributed to health and other bodies who it is hoped will recognise the importance and value of its work, and perhaps take some of it forward. - Manchester Stingers Women's Football Club – nearly 4 years old, established member of North West Women's Football league and going from strength to strength
- The Jessies Lesbians Walking and Cycling Group – 3 years old, regular monthly walks and occasional trips and cycle rides
- Lesbian and Gay Salsa – going for over 3 years, now re-locating to bigger more accessible venue and getting new publicity
- Village Amazons – start-up grant in 2001, currently getting established, watch this space
- Lesbian and Gay Adventure Group – start-up grant in 2001, watch this space for details
- Northern Wave Lesbian and Gay Swimming – going over 3 years, regular swims and other activities planned and for the boys
- Gay Men's Football Team – **the only one** which existed before TM! Goes from strength to strength.

NATIONAL HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY– 27TH JANUARY 2002

Thousands of lesbians were among the millions of people who were murdered in death camps by the Nazis in Germany during the Second World War. Lesbians and gay men were amongst those – including Jews, black people and disabled people – who were seen by the Nazi regime as 'inferior'. Lesbians were made to wear the black triangle in the camps, and gay men wore the pink triangle.

The aim of National Holocaust Memorial Day is to never forget those who died, and to learn from history what can happen when prejudices are taken to their worst extremes. Unfortunately, despite the respectful words of government ministers at such times, lesbians and gay men are still not recognised as 'equal' in the eyes of the law in this country, and suffer hate crime and discrimination. Let us not forget we still have a lot to fight for, as well as enjoy and be proud of, as lesbians today!
