EUROPRIDE DETAILS RELEASED!

Manchester will host Europride 2003 from 15th – 25th August, Europe's biggest Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender (LGBT) Festival. A dynamic and varied programme of events has been planned.

Central to the celebrations is the annual Mardi Gras event (22nd – 25th August). This will be bigger than ever before, kicking off with a parade (23rd August) through the city centre streets. And there will be a Women's Space! As in previous year's, the Women's Space group (formerly Amazonia) are organising the space and are currently on the lookout for volunteers to help with fundraising, event planning and volunteer coordination. A prime location in the village has been secured and more details on the Women's Space will be released soon.

Other planned activities include:

- The launch weekend (16th – 17th August) will include an outdoor celebration in Manchester's city centre.
- A full day conference held in the Town Hall, co-ordinated by Manchester City Council, where issues directly affecting LGBT lives will be discussed among local authorities, LGBT organisations and a range of agencies and policy makers (22nd August).
- The Lesbian and Gay Film Festival at the Filmworks.
- Sporting events, including the Northern Wave European Swimming Tournament (22nd August).
- A LGBT heritage trail is planned for Manchester and is supported by the National Heritage Lottery. As part of a project called "Out in the Past", the trail takes the form of a series of Pink Plaques celebrating lost and hidden stories from the city's pink past. The project also includes opportunities for community groups to bring the past to the present through a campaign banner-making initiative in partnership with the People's History Museum.
- Young people from Lesbian and Gay Youth Manchester, in partnership with the city's Joint Health Unit, will showcase "Journeys", a discovery and celebration of their lives through an art exhibition (15th – 25th August) and a stage performance (15th August), both in the Zion Centre. Young Lesbians from the group, together with the LCP, will run a discussion seminar and host a social night for all women.
- The Women's Space group and LCP are organizing a 'Lesbian Expo' event in the Town Hall on 20th and 21st August. There will stalls from many different voluntary and community groups, skill-swap sessions, holistic therapies, workshops, music and dancing and much, much more. More details will be released soon.

LEZZIE CAMP 2003

Lezzie Camp 2003 is on! Following the success of last year's camp, with about fifty dykes in all attending from two days to two weeks, Lezzie camp 2003 is being organized. Lezzie Camp is held near Wray in Lancashire. It is situated in a beautiful secluded, wooded valley, with a river running through it. It offers a great chance to meet and connect with dykes and kids from all over, and have fun.

Tents go in the woods, on the hill, or in the meadow. There is a barn and a couple of large tents to give some communal space if it rains and to use for kids play sessions, workshops, cabarets etc.

Last years big hit was a swap shop where dykes offered various things for swaps, from cigarette papers to Shiatsu. Workshops included past life regressions and beautiful Goddess. The Kids made a lovely wishing tree and generally had a great time with the play leaders.

This year camp is from **Saturday 2nd August - Sunday 17th August**. Costs are on a sliding scale and start at just £7.50 per day (this includes camping and all food). Friday 1st August is setting up day. Come then if you want to help out, have some fun and camp that night for free!

Dykes from all over the country, some from other countries come. People come alone, in groups, or as couples, with or without kids.

LIBERTAS LESBIAN ARTS FESTIVAL

Unless you've been hiding under a rock for the last 18 months or so, you'll have probably heard of the Libertas Lesbian Arts Festival. Libertas is a women's bookshop (predominately stocking lesbian books) which is based in York. Last year they took the bold step of organising a lesbian book festival in York, which was attended by many well known writers, comics and singers. Thousands of women from all over the country attended and a good time was had by all.

This year, they're doing it again but on an even bigger scale. The Libertas Lesbian Arts Festival will run for 5 days from **Wednesday 29th October to Sunday 2nd November** and include a lesbian film festival, lesbian theatre, creative writing workshops, concerts, lesbian opera, poetry plus two full days of the lesbian book festival and a lesbian 'mega-disco'.

Already an amazing line-up of lesbian writers has been announced including Claire McNab, Val McDermid, Jackie Kay, Sarah Waters, Sandi Toksvig, Stella Duffy and Helen Sandler. Details of singers and comedians are expected to be released soon.

COULD SECTION 28 BE REPEALED?

As you may be aware, a repeal of the infamous Section 28 is currently being discussed in the House of Lords (again). Section 28 was repealed in Scotland on the 21st of June 2000 but still remains on the statute book in England and Wales.

Section 28 of the Local Government Act 1988 reads:

A local authority shall not—

(a) intentionally promote homosexuality or publish material with the intention of promoting homosexuality;

(b) promote the teaching in any maintained school of the acceptability of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship.

This act only applies only to a local authority. It does not apply to schools, or to any head-teacher, governor, or member of school staff and must not prevent school staff from providing unprejudiced information about homosexuality. When the Bill was originally passed, the Government declared that it should not restrict Local Authorities from funding and providing: lesbian gay & bisexual social groups and events, helplines, counselling services, books in libraries, or artistic and dramatic presentations.

"However... the existence of Section 28 continues to cause confusion and harm. Teachers are confused about what they can and cannot say and do, and whether they can help pupils who face homophobic bullying and abuse. Local authorities are unclear as to what legitimate services they can provide for lesbian, gay and bisexual members of their communities."

On the 3rd of April the House of Lords held its first debate on the repeal of Section 28 in England and Wales. The amendment to repeal the bill was previously passed by 19 votes to 2 in a committee of the House of Commons and was then supported by 356 votes to 127 in a full debate in the House of Commons earlier this year. Although the amendment to repeal Section 28 seems to have good cross-party support, it is clear that some members of the House of Lords will still attempt to block the repeal. Earlier Commons attempts to repeal the clause were blocked in the Lords three years ago, by majorities of 45 and 42.

The Bill was due to be considered by a committee of the House of Lords after Easter. The final vote on the repeal of Section 28 is due in early May. A number of organisations are campaigning to scrap Section 28. The lesbian and gay campaigning group, Stonewall, are spearheading a campaign to scrap Section 28 in England and Wales – you can sign their online petition at:
